TAHR HUNT BY E-BIKE

As I peddled off up the Tasman river track I could hear my dear wifes warning, "Don't you scratch my new E-bike" so with caution I started off my journey.

Two days earlier I had hunted up the true right of the Tasman & had stayed at Ball hut, meeting allsorts, including extreme skiers, European track runners & hikers, most of which just go up to the hut, enjoy the view, tick it off & out again.

One reason I like going up there is the few animals you find are used to human activity so you can casually get a lot closer to take a few photos. The downside is that I tend to use up my camera batteries too quickly.

I only saw two bulls & four Chamois, one of the Chamois I decided to take but after getting into position above them two trampers came along & set up a tent, so I pulled the plug on that idea. The next day I headed out for the other side, stopping to sign out at the very busy Doc office. I enjoyed a well deserved coffee with Sir Ed.

When I finally arrived at the end of the track feeling good that the bikes paint work was still intact, I pitched my tent amongst the scrub but not before glassing up the valley in hope of boosting my hopes of great hunting adventures in the final few days that were left of our branch club hunt.





The next morning it was raining so I gladly caught up on some much needed rest. By lunch time the weather was good so I headed off up the hill, planning to hunt down this rough looking gut. Half way down I concluded this was a nanny feeding area, all the green stuff was well groomed & I could see six nannies at work.

I shifted over abit to the side of the hill where it was covered in scrub, matagouri & lots of grass. I soon spotted a bull through the gaps in the scrub lying down in the grass but he spotted me & casually walked over the edge & was gone. He looked good so I decided to take him if I got another chance. I had a couple of glimpses of his pale hairy coat, he seemed to be feeding back towards the gut which had less cover, this might offer a shot at him., which it did.

Sadly I rushed the shot, it did not drop him on the spot, instead he leaped over the edge into the dirtiest, steepest terrain. It took me four hours the next morning to find him. I found I'd over estimated the size of his horns they were just 11 inches.

On the upside I did get some good photos of our NZ falcon & came across a valley of stunted Kowhai trees in bloom, a nice surprise.

I had an early tea & went out for a short evening hunt, I got quite a surprise to see four bulls but they had spotted me. At one stage they walked single file straight up, which gave me a good look at their horns against their necks.

One seemed to have a good curve & stood out against the rest so I kept my eye on him. When he stopped, turned & looked back I squeezed a shot away, after the poor shot on the last bull tahr it was good to see this one just fall over. It took over an hour to get to him & by this time there was only an hour of daylight left.

He wasn't in a good spot for photo's, so after gutting him & using a lot of energy I managed to drag him up hill about 10 mtrs . I wanted his skin & all the meat.

I could see the bad weather forecasted had already hit the Mount Cook village across the valley. I broke off a lot of wilding pine branches to sit the meat on, put more on top then threw the skin over the lot planning to retrieve it all tomorrow.

It was now raining steadily, by the time I got back to camp it was 23.00hrs.





Not long after hitting the sack the most powerful display of thunder & lightning started. Claps of thunder that lasted from 20-35 secs rolled up the Tasman valley, sometimes the thunder seemed to be right above my tent, the noise was horrific.

It went on most of the night. Chop creek doen't have a big water catchment but about six times during the night I could hear a wave of water & rocks coming down the naarrow valley behind the camp which would only last for about 15mins then stop, so there must have been some big dumps of rain up the valley.

I don't think I got much sleep but I just loved the whole amazing experience.





Next morning I retrieved the meat & skin & in the afternoon I took a load out to the ute. This was made easier with the gale force winds behind me, only took 30minutes. Even the dirty fast flowing

stream crossings were fun as long as I remembered to crankup the battery assistance to the max before entering the water & giving it stick, hoping I didn't hit a big rock hiding in the water. It was the soft shingle banks on the other side that were the hardest but Yay for ebikes.

The return trip though took 1 1/2hrs,and at Black rock point the wind was so strong that even in granny gear & the highest battery assistance aiding me & giving it all I had I still came to a stop and before I could get my foot on the ground I was going backwards, once I had pushed it around the point we were away again.

That evening I saw the tail end of a big bodied bull but not his head. Maybe that's the "big one" I will just have to come back next year.

Next morning it was packup & gone by 8.30am, the wind wasn't so strong but still pushed me along the flats without having to peddle much. I stopped & watched the chopper up high cutting its way into the wind to retrieve the boys up in the valley. The pilot told them that they had a 100kph tailwind on the way out.

I was just about out when a beautiful rainbow appeared over the other side of the valley, a nice ending to a great trip. I couldn't wait to hear how the others got on.





BOP BRANCH PERSONAL LOCATOR BEACONS (PLB's) FOR HIRE

Available to Branch members for hire. These devices can save lives by drastically reducing Search and Rescue times.

Members will need to:

- 1. Book the units in advance.
- 2. Be a current member and show their membership card when picking them up.
- 3. Fill in an Outdoors Intention Form to be held by the Branch custodian issuing the unit.
- 4. Pay a \$40 cash bond, refundable on return, in original condition and on time.
- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640). There is no cost for the renewal of the unit if it is used in an emergency

but if possible we will need it returned. Any costs incurred for rescue by emergency services or false PLB activation will be the sole responsibility of the user.

HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

Hunting Safety Guidelines (Some suggestions from committee discussions)

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- 4. Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.



A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact. Aldo Leopold, The Sand County Almanac.

A member of the New Zealand Deerstalkers' Association Incorporated will be expected to;

- 1. Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same
- 2. Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws
- 4. Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity 'in situ'
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.
