NZDA book offer


CHASING WHITETAILS The magic of hunting Stewart Island. Author John DeLury

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

It is late May and I am on a hunting trip in the King Country, camping in an area that I have hunted a lot over the last 12 years. As usual at this time of the year, the nights are very cold and you need a really good sleeping bag etc. Last night the water in my camp water container was frozen by midnight, and the first hour of hunting that morning was like walking on concrete. I stayed in the bush a lot as wherever the ground was frozen, it was just so noisy to hunt. Five hours of hunting in an area that I knew and all I saw was one hind with a runner and not a lot of sign.

Back in camp I had a feed and a rest, then mid- afternoon I headed out to hunt a sharp spur and bushy saddle that I have not hunted before. The area was more open and easier to get into than I expected, just steep in places, so that was a pleasant surprise. I took my time and just enjoyed the hunting. Apart from seeing one black rabbit and a bit of recent deer sign, I saw nothing, so I set myself up on a small mound overlooking the bushy saddle. There was bush either side with an open grassy area in between, the kind of place all red-blooded hunters dream about.

There was not much activity, but after about an hour I detected some movement on the bush edge at the base of the saddle. Out stepped a spiker, along with a 3 year old small 6 point stag. The stags slowly fed out from the bush, so I set up my rifle and ranged the distance, 240 metres. I watched and waited for a while, hoping that a bigger stag would show up, when suddenly they ran back into the bush. They obviously got my wind, which surprised me as most of the time it was in my face.

I just stayed set up hoping the deer would return. With about 30 minutes of daylight left, I was just getting ready to pack it in. Suddenly, further up the ridge, out from the bush ran 7 hinds. They ran across a grassy area and disappeared into the bush on the other side. "Heck, they must have got my wind as well, as they didn't muck around. I really must have a wash."

I sat there totally bemused by this, when a large stag stepped out of the bush where the hinds had been. He hesitated before following the hinds' path. A quick look through the scope and I could see he was a long way off but had some good tops. With the light fading fast and no time to range him, I decide to take, for me a very long shot, so I held high, settled and squeezed the trigger. With the shot he dropped like a log, so I grabbed the range finder and sighted to where he fell - 368metres. Without a doubt one of the longest shots I have ever taken.

The day had started off really cold with no deer around, but it had just got a whole heap better.

The day had started off really cold with no deer around, but it had just got a whole heap better. By the time I had packed my gear, crossed the saddle and climbed to where the stag was, it was getting dark, so I got out my torch and located the beast.

To say that I was gobsmacked would be an understatement! I have hunted in eight countries, seen some awesome sights, but there at my feet was a sight right up with the best, and so totally unexpected. The head had a very wide span, heavy timber, rich pearling and 27 points. They grow this gear every year; incredible really when you think about it. In 12 years of hunting in the area, I've never seen any stags like this one, although I know that in one of the local areas in the front country they used to keep some stags around for the Aussies to shoot. I spoke to one of the locals and he said that they had not seen any around for 3-4 years. The good news is this stag was with 7 hinds, so it would be fair to say that his genes are in the local herd, as we aged him at 7 years old. I gutted out the stag, returned back to camp for a mostly sleepless night. I spent most of the next day butchering and packing out the meat, the head and antlers were a big trip alone.

It took me a couple of weeks to come to terms with just what I had shot. As it was well after the roar and I had recently shot my lifetime 14 point trophy, I had gone on this hunt with low expectations really, to check out an area for a future hunting trip. I did not even have my camera with me. It just goes to prove that if you are hunting in good country, just expect the unexpected. These mature stags normally stay well- hidden so you just have to be in the right place at the right time. I was going to put this head into the Sika Show this year, but it has just been cancelled. *Bugger!*

I might bring it into the club sometime as it is well worth looking at.



BOP BRANCH PERSONAL LOCATOR BEACONS (PLB's) FOR HIRE

Available to Branch members for hire. These devices can save lives by drastically reducing Search and Rescue times.

Members will need to:

- 1. Book the units in advance.
- 2. Be a current member and show their membership card when picking them up.
- 3. Fill in an Outdoors Intention Form to be held by the Branch custodian issuing the unit.
- 4. Pay a \$40 cash bond, refundable on return, in original condition and on time.
- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640). There is no cost for the renewal of the unit if it is used in an emergency

but if possible we will need it returned. Any costs incurred for rescue by emergency services or false PLB activation will be the sole responsibility of the user.

HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

Hunting Safety Guidelines (Some suggestions from committee discussions)

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- 4. Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.


CODE OF ETHICS

A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact.

A member of the New Zealand Deerstalkers' Association Incorporated will be expected to;

- 1. Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same
- 2. Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws
- 4. Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity 'in situ'
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.
