CLUB HUNTS – GETTING THE MOST FROM THEM AND THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

CLUB HUNT IS
THE BREAD AND
BUTTER OF ANY
DEERSTALKING CLUB. IT'S
A TIME TO CHECK OUT NEW
HUNTING LOCATIONS, GET
TO KNOW OTHER MEMBERS,
LEARN NEW SKILLS, AND MY
PERSONAL FAVOURITE,
SPIN A FEW YARNS.

I still remember my first club hunt. I was a teenager and we did a fly camp at the Te Tuhi/North South junction. I have a couple of vivid memories from that trip. The first is a family sized tent that Paul Adams and I found in the middle of nowhere.

We marveled at how anyone had got it there in the first place, but we were even more surprised when we looked inside... there was porn scattered all over the floor! The second

memory was him telling me that a deer I'd spied was too small to shoot.

It would have been my first deer and at the time and I was a bit disappointed. However because of that club hunt I had the courage to go back into the Kaimais and I shot my first deer not far from that spot. It must have been a good lesson aye Paul.

But I digress, the reason I wanted to write this article is because I regularly get members asking me what's the deal with club hunts. There seems to be a list of common questions, so I thought I'd jot some down with appropriate answers. In no particular order, here we go...

"WE WELCOME EVERYONE TO COME ON CLUB HUNTS.

THIS INCLUDES YOUR PARTNER, CHILDREN OR EVEN A KEEN FRIEND."

Q: Who can go on a club hunt?

A: We welcome everyone to come on club hunts. This includes your partner, children or even a keen friend. Some hunts have restrictions on numbers and some require a certain degree of experience, so it always pays to check with the hunt organiser just to be sure.

Q: I'm new to hunting and not confident on my own, will I get partnered up.

A: Short answer, most of the time. Long answer, we try our best to partner up new hunters but this isn't always possible due to numbers and the experience levels within the group. Our normal process is to plan the hunting each night and where necessary partner people up. We will never leave you to fend for yourself but on the odd occasion you might be directed to walk up an easy riverbed on your own. Please try also to consider that experienced hunters may not necessarily want a newbie with them on a hunt - this might be their only time away from reality or they may just want to do a serious day's hunting.

Q: What if I don't know anyone?

A: No worries, this is the best possible time to get to know people! Hunting and campin

to get to know people! Hunting and camping with a bunch of like-minded individuals is the best way to get to know them. It's the ideal time to make new hunting buddies and it will make you feel more welcome at the club as you get to know other members.

Q: I've never been to that location, how do I hunt it?

A: We deliberately plan our club hunts to go to different areas throughout the year. This is so you can get exposure to different terrain and different species throughout NZ all within the supportive club environment. You may not be successful on this trip, but it will give you the chance to explore the area and should hopefully inspire you to return.

Q: What gear do I need?

A: Each hunt is slightly different but at minimum you should have a pack, sleeping bag, cooking gear, and hunting kit. You don't need a huge amount to get started so I'd recommend going easy on the gadgets until you know what you really need. I personally think that one of the best things about a club hunt is seeing what other people bring:

it's a favourite nighttime conversation and you will ultimately pick up a variety of tips and tricks that make successive hunts more enjoyable.

Q: What's the deal with transport?

A: This varies slightly with each hunt but wherever possible we try to carpool to save costs. The hunt organiser will help coordinate this but please remember to flick the driver

Q: Do we share the meat?

some gas money.

A: We try to encourage members to share in their success and divvy up any animals shot. While it's not a hard rule, it's encouraged so that everyone can feel like they've had a successful trip. Please note that you're expected to help carry it out if you want to take it home.

Q: Is there mattresses at the hut?
A: It's surprising how often I get asked this

question. The short answer is yes, there is. I'm yet to find a DOC hut without a mattress but it never hurts to carry a Thermarest if you have one - other members of the public may have beaten you to the hut or sleeping outside on the balcony might be preferable, especially on a hot summers night.

Q: What food do I bring?

A: This is entirely up to you and will vary for different trips. If you're packing in, then lightweight food such as Back Country Cuisine is preferable (but not compulsory) but if you're driving to the location you can bring as much as you like. I personally like to eat so I happily carry in a pack full of goodies knowing it will only get lighter as the trip goes on.

Q: Can I bring alcohol on a trip?

A: Normally it's not a problem but it never hurts to check with the hunt organiser first.

As an example, I enjoy a cold beer after a long day on the hill and I often stash a few cans in a handy creek, but this might not be appropriate on one of our hare hunts where we're spotlighting all night.

NZDA BOP RANGE UPDATE:

BACKING BOARDS:

Some of you will have already been to the range and seen the backing board trial at 25m. We have screwed four fence palings (cut to length) into the centre of each position. The idea is that these individual fence palings can very easily be unscrewed and replaced when shot out so will be faster and cheaper to replace when needed

So far these appear to holding up well and we will continue to do this at other distances. The sides of the positions will also be replaced as needed.

WORKING BEES:

When we can be sure we have enough supplies ready to go (palings, posts etc) - many of you will be aware how difficult it is to source well priced timber at the moment, we will announce some working bees.

These will be held on a variety of day's: weekends and after work (in the summer) to suit different members. Along with replacing posts and backing boards we need the drums in the butts lifted and turned or replaced and some topped up, weed spraying, boundary checked, rubbish taken to land fill.

Do you have access to a supply of 'off cut' timber - but not scraps, good lengths of palings or posts that could be donated to the club or offered at a discounted rate??



- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640).





CODE OF ETHICS

"A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact."

A MEMBER OF THE NEW ZEALAND DEERSTALKERS' ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED WILL BE EXPECTED TO:

- Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same.
- Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him.
- Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws.
- Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors.
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity 'in situ'.
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting.
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.



HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

Some suggestions from committee discussions.

- It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.
