THE 11TH ANNUAL TAHR BRANCH HUNT

THE BAY OF PLENTY DEERSTALKERS 11TH ANNUAL TAHR HUNT TOOK PLACE BETWEEN 31ST OCTOBER AND 6TH NOVEMBER. WITH A TOTAL OF 21 HUNTERS, 14 OF THOSE WERE HUNTING IN THE MT COOK NATIONAL PARK, IN 4 SEPARATE LOCATIONS AND 7 IN NEARBY RANGES IN TWO SEPARATE LOCATIONS.

All parties had successful hunts with plenty of meat taken home and some personal best trophies. Again the weather was near perfect apart from it being a bit windy in the early part.

The parties outside the National Park in the Hopkins catchment had a successful hunt and a great experience however while hunting there was a doc culling operation happening in parts of the area. This was some what of a surprise as it was our understanding the culling operations were to be completed by the end of October due to the kidding.

All parties in the National Park also had very successful hunts. About half of these hunters were first time tahr hunters which included teenagers, children and women. For these the experience is one they will never forget. They all had the thrill of shooting a bull even if it was not the biggest trophy but I am sure they will be back looking for mr big.

DOC aerial culling of animals this year and in previous years has had a dramatic effect on the numbers of nannies and bulls in Mt Cook National Park. The numbers of nannies would have been less than 10% of sighted animals.

With this in mind I wonder what is the target of the reduction in numbers DOC is aiming for in these culling operation. While there is sufficient numbers of animals in the National Park recreational hunters will continue to participate in productive hunts and continue to do their part in animal control.

The absolute delight for me was to see and hear about these first time hunters achieve not only an animal but and experience in the alpine areas that they will never forget and will want to repeat themselves and for their next generation. Most are lining up again for next years hunt.

THE TROPHY WAS ESPECIALLY TARNISHED, MORE THAN I WOULD HAVE EXPECTED IF SOMEONE HAD POLISHED IT LAST YEAR, BUT IT HADN'T BEEN AWARDED LAST YEAR. IN FACT THIS TROPHY HADN'T **BEEN AWARDED 18 YEARS OF THE LAST 55. MAYBE IT'S** CHALLENGING TO WIN.

The necessarily long polishing session gave me plenty of time to read the names of previous winners, some names featured multiple times. The previous winners included names of legend, club officers, and several branch presidents from the past.

It was clear the trophy had taken some hits and it had the scars to show. Possibly someone's child had knocked it from the mantle piece where it had been proudly put on display, any manner of events could have brought about such character, the events now lost to time. All this polishing and thought caused me to ponder my hunt that had led to me being awarded this trophy.

What of the previous winners? I wondered where they had shot their competition entry, was it a magnificent example of the species or was it their personal best... I will likely never know. How many of these previous winners have sat and polished this exact trophy pondering similar thoughts.

The first winner held this trophy two decades before I was born. What was it like hunting these animals back then? Did he even have a scope on his rifle? What did his trophy score? Did he get it mounted?

I started to think of other members of the branch now and future. Who will read my name on this trophy in the decades to come? Will they know who I am? Will it be one of my children, or maybe a niece or nephew? Perhaps my wife might win it one day. Perhaps a grandchild, how special would that be?

This really got me thinking about how privileged it is to be awarded one of these trophies from our annual AHT competition. It's stamping your name on history, giving the opportunity to someone in the future to be inspired by and awed by your name, your story, your legend.

NZDA BOP RANGE UPDATE:

RANGE STANDING ORDERS REMINDER ("The Range Rules"):

- Range ticket holders CANNOT allow other non-range ticket holders or nonmembers to shoot at our range.
- Shooting at 200m may only be from kneeling/sitting, prone or bench rest positions.
- Shooting at 300m may only be from the prone or bench rest positions.
- All shots should be falling on or near your target on the target backing board.
- All shots must be fired deliberately one at a time. Non-aimed shots are not permitted.
- All targets must be located onto the fixed target backers 25m, 50m, 100, 200m or 300m target lines.
- No targets between target lines and free standing target holders are prohibited.

BACKING BOARDS:

We are continuing to roll out the fence paling backing boards at each distance. We are screwing four fence palings into the centre of each position. These individual fence palings can very easily be unscrewed and replaced when shot out so will be faster and cheaper to replace when needed.

A supply of palings along with the screws will be left at the range, ideally the palings can be replaced as and when needed.

WORKING BEES:

Our working bees are underway again - thanks to everyone who has been able to give up a couple of hours of their time so far. We will continue re-building each range, focusing on a specific range each working bee. Working bees are needed and if you want to enjoy our range then put in the time to help out when you can.

Do you have access to a supply of "off cut" timber - but not scraps, good lengths of palings or posts that could be donated to the club or offered at a discounted rate??



BOP BRANCH PERSONAL LOCATOR BEACONS (PLB'S) FOR HIRE

AVAILABLE TO BRANCH MEMBERS FOR HIRE. THESE DEVICES CAN SAVE LIVES BY DRASTICALLY REDUCING SEARCH AND RESCUE TIMES.

Members will need to:

- 1. Book the units in advance.
- 2. Be a current member and show their membership card when picking them up.
- 3. Fill in an Outdoors Intention Form to be held by the Branch custodian issuing the unit.
- 4. Pay a \$40 cash bond, refundable on return, in original condition and on time.
- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640).



CODE OF ETHICS

"A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact."

A MEMBER OF THE NEW ZEALAND DEERSTALKERS' ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED WILL BE EXPECTED TO:

- Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same.
- Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him.
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws.
- Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors.
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity '*in situ*'.
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting.
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.



HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

Some suggestions from committee discussions.

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.
