PRESIDENTS REPORT: MAY 2022

WHAT A BUSY MONTH APRIL HAS BEEN. THE ROAR HAS COME AND PAST FOR THE RED STAGS, THE SIKA ARE QUIETING DOWN AND MANY OF US WILL NOW BE FOCUSED ON THE END OF THE FALLOW RUT OR PLANNING FOR A RUSA OR SAMBAR HUNT.

I was really pleased to get out on the club roar hunt over Easter weekend with my son, and was privileged to share in the excitement following two members taking their first deer. It reminded me of my first successful solo hunt, and witnessing the success of others was a great encouragement to my son.

At the end of March, following a detailed reading of the police's proposed regulations for shooting clubs and ranges, I contacted as many other clubs in our region as I could. It was proposed that we hold an interclub meeting to discuss the police proposals. This meeting was hosted at our clubrooms on April 12 and had representatives from 12 shooting organisations in attendance.

At the meeting we discussed the key issues in the proposed regulations and how best to lobby for more reasonable regulations. It was decided against inviting MPs to a meeting, that instead, club representatives should arrange appointments with MPs to discuss their individual club situations and how the regulations would affect them.

Subject to the approval of the various committees the clubs also decided to collectively support the release of a media statement. The result being the statement released on Thursday 21st April. You can read the statement later in this newsletter.

As you would have seen in the email, we have been working on a Branch Strategy which has now been finalised. The next step is to draft a business plan and budget for presentation at the AGM in July.

These documents will help give direction to the committee through out the year and provide clarity to how we can achieve the Branch's objectives.

With the AGM being just over two months away, now is a great time to consider whether you would be willing to join the committee or contribute in another capacity. If you have questions about what is involved you're welcome to ask any member of the committee or attend a committee meeting as a guest to observe what goes on.

Don't forget to prepare your heads for Measuring Night, and be sure to bring everything along no matter the size. You never know what is going to be entered and with all the disruptions over the last while you could have a winning trophy. It's also really good to see the results of everyone's efforts throughout the year and the heads provide for plenty of discussion and hunting yarns.

With the May Club Night being the first in months I'm expecting many will be looking forward to it and we will likely have a strong turnout. We have a great line up of presentations for the evening and I know there will be plenty of hunting stories to exchange following the roar.

Hopefully we can now put restrictions behind us and get on with club business as usual. I'm looking forward to the many club activities coming up on the calendar including, at the time of writing this, the inaugural Peeking Wallaby Match on the 1st of the month and I'm sure Baden will be reporting on it at Club Night.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

FOR ALL MEMBERS

POLICE PROPOSALS FOR REGULATIONS FOR SHOOTING CLUBS AND RANGES

The proposals in the discussion document released by police in late March would be devastating for hunting and shooting clubs across the country, for our sport and way of life generally.

As you would have seen in the email from National Office on the 12th April, the NZDA have sent out an Information Pack to help with making submissions. The expectation is that branches across the country including ours will make submissions tailored to their unique situations. It is equally important that members make their own submission.

The proposals would be the end of the HUNTS program as we know it. The proposals include limitations that could be the end of junior and family membership and prevent under 16s and unlicenced shooters from shooting at the range under supervision.

These proposals would be the end of hunting and shooting clubs as we know them, the NZDA included.

Please take the time to read the discussion document and make a submission relevant to your personal situation.

The purpose of the Hunter Buddy Program is 'To provide an opportunity for new members and postHUNTS course graduate hunters to gain valuable experience with more seasoned hunters in order to develop and consolidate skills and knowledge".

In addition to this, the program aims *to establish friendships and support networks for new hunters within the club to enable them to feel a sense of

belonging to a hunting community of outdoor enthusiasts

If you're an experienced hunter, think about how your knowledge and skills could benefit those new to the adventure of hunting. If you're a novice hunter think about what you can do to prepare yourself for your next hunting adventure and grow your capabilities.

The HUNTS course is still the best way for those new to hunting to immerse themselves in the basics of hunting and establish a solid foundation of knowledge to build on in the future.

The Hunter Buddy Program provides the opportunity for those who have completed a HUNTS course to continue being mentored by more seasoned hunters as well as the opportunity for those less experienced and new to the Branch to build on their existing knowledge, while establishing relationships with other members.

Experienced hunters volunteering to be 'buddied up' with an inexperienced hunter will be vetted by those coordinating



the program to ensure inexperienced hunters are paired up with a suitably capable hunter who has the necessary experience.

Experienced hunters who participate in the program and who meet the criteria will be entered into a prize draw, with the lucky winner

RANGE STANDING ORDERS REMINDER: "THE RANGE RULES"

Range ticket holders CANNOT allow other non-range ticket holders or non-members to shoot at our range. The name, date and time start time of shooters shall be recorded each time they use the range. Range flags and warning signs are to be enabled at the following locations prior to firing:

- The Range status sign's "Caution Range in Use" warning shall be displayed when the range is open for use.
- The red firing line flag shall be hoisted when the range is open for use.
- The firing line flag must be lowered, and the range status sign closed when the range is closed.

An empty chamber indicator (ECI) MUST be inserted in the chamber at all times except when the Range Officer allows the shooter onto the firing point and gives permission to remove the ECI.

WHANGANUI RIVER CANOE HUNT

QUEENS BIRTHDAY WEEKEND 4TH – 6TH JUNE

THIS HUNT IS A THREE DAY CANOE TRIP DOWN THE WHANGANUI RIVER FROM WHAKAHORO TO PIPIRIKI. THERE'S DOC HUTS AND CAMPSITES TO STAY IN ALONG THE RIVER.

This river is suited to canoes or kayaks, inflatable vessels aren't suitable due to the slow moving water and potential for head winds.

There are plenty of goats to be shot, the chance of a pig or two, and opportunities to go for a quick bush hunt along the way. For those with a game bird licence, shotguns are an option, with plenty of ducks and geese about.

NZDA BOP CLUB CHILLER

Don't forget to pay your chiller fee when paying your membership fees. The chiller access code will change on the 1st of March so if you haven't paid your fees on time, you may find you can't access the chiller until your fees are processed.

Hopefully there are plenty of stags moving through the chiller this roar. A reminder of the rules below.

CHILLER USE RULES

- Chiller use is a privilege that may be removed if access is abused or rules not adhered to.
- Clean up after yourself, every time you access the chiller.
- Use a fish bin or other suitable container to catch dripping blood etc. and remove from site when you take your meat away.
- No skinning or butchering on the NZDA premises. The chiller is for hanging only, no processing of any sort is allowed.
- All waste must be removed from the premises when you take your meat away, including any part of an animal, blood, and all wastewater.
- All animals/meat must be tagged with a label denoting the date hung, name
 and contact number of the person who hung it in the chiller. Any meat without a
 label will be considered a donation to the club.
- The maximum time for hanging any meat or animal is 10 days.
- Do not hang any foul meat or contaminated carcasses.
- Take care not to contaminate anyone else's meat with hair, blood, dirt etc.

It is preferable to hang all carcasses with the skin on and to hang any partially processed meat in a breathable bag or muslin cloth. Hanging carcasses and meat should not touch the chiller walls or they may (partially) freeze.

Respect the facility and other members meat.

Subject matter to be relevant to hunting, hunting country and/or associated activities of NZDA members and have been taken from land within New Zealand and, in respect to SECTION A only, not taken from any form of conveyance.

- In SECTIONS A, B1, B2, B3, subject matter to be in its wild outdoor state and not in any form of captivity. Photographs of wounded or dead animals, birds, insects, reptiles or amphibians will be disqualified.
- In SECTION C, the subject matter is to be scenic and relative to hunting country, any human activity should be of minor importance.
- In SECTION D, the subject matter is to be of any NZ floral (tree, plant, vegetation, bush etc) subject in its natural environment.
- In SECTION E, the main component of the subject matter is to be human activity, ie camp scenes, hunting or NZDA associated activities. Human

interaction must be the main feature of the photograph and should tell or indicate a story.

- 5. SECTION F: Best print of all Sections
- 6. The judges/organisers have the right to place any junior photographic entry into the competition even if they have not specifically requested to enter this competition so long as their validity as a junior is confirmed.

Members will need to:

- Book the units in advance.
- 2. Be a current member and show their membership card when picking them up.
- Fill in an Outdoors Intention Form to be held by the Branch custodian issuing the unit.
- 4. Pay a \$40 cash bond, refundable on return, in original condition and on time.
- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640).



BAY OF PLENTY SHOOTING CLUBS UNDER THREAT OF CLOSURE DUE TO PROPOSED NEW REGULATIONS

BAY OF PLENTY
SHOOTING
CLUBS FEAR

Clubs across the region have united in their objections to the proposed new rules which they say threaten their financial viability by creating extra certification costs and ongoing compliance requirements. If adopted, the changes could force smaller clubs and those unable to pass on the extra costs to its members to permanently close their ranges and disband.

They are now appealing to all firearms users to make urgent submissions expressing their objections to the police proposals.

This month delegates from more than 10 Bay of

Plenty shooting clubs met in Tauranga to discuss the police regulations that govern their clubs and shooting ranges, and the proposed changes. The clubs cover rifle shooting, service rifles, pistol, black powder, and clay target disciplines.

Changes, if implemented, would include costly certification of clubs and ranges, onerous ongoing compliance requirements and could even include banning firearms safety

training for under 16-yearolds and those new to shooting, as well as the endof-school shooting teams.

Founded in 1950, the Bay of Plenty Branch of the New Zealand Deerstalkers Association (NZDA) is the largest and most established shooting club in the region with more than 600 members.

It shares the views of other clubs who agree that the proposed rules governing their future club operations simply go a step too far.

In 2020, a number of changes were made to the Arms Act 1983 to further control and regulate firearms in New Zealand

New regulations to increase oversight of shooting clubs and ranges have now also been proposed, and Police are inviting feedback during a consultation period, with submissions closing 4th May 2022.

NZDA Bay of Plenty Branch president Reuben Hayward says shooting clubs already provide a safe, controlled environment for users of all sporting and recreational shooting disciplines. Ranges also offer hunters a safe environment to sight-in rifles before heading into the bush.

There is a real risk that smaller clubs and ranges will close, leaving users with fewer facilities to use their firearms and educate shooters on best practice.

"The clubs believe that the new regulations are trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist and are not aligned with the stated purpose of enhancing public safety," says Hayward.

"There is no link between shooting clubs and criminal firearm use. The regulations go well beyond the requirements of the Act and the Police have clearly overstepped the mark."

Before the consultation period ends on 4th May. clubs are urging every firearms user to make a submission here.



CODE OF ETHICS

"A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact."

A MEMBER OF THE NEW ZEALAND DEERSTALKERS' ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED WILL BE EXPECTED TO:

- Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same.
- Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him.
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws.
- Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors.
- Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity 'in situ'.
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting.
- Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.



HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

Some suggestions from committee discussions.

- It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.
