Woodhill, by Jon Howard

We arrived at Woodhill shortly before dawn and then began heading to our blocks. Dave abd U headed to the West Block and went down the main trail seeing plenty of sign as well as a pheasant and a pair of rabbits. We then proceeded to traverse the edge of the pines and kanuka until around 10 o'clock. Then we noticed some fresh sign and spore heading down a ridge line into the kanuka, we followed this trail along the ridge until the first deer of the day walked in front of us, an average sized yearling, unfortunately I wasn't in a position to fire a lethal shot se we let it wander off hoping to cut back around and get another chance. Unfortunately this was not to be.

Shortly after we heard the report of Logans rifle, and continued along the edge of the pines until I noticed a trail heading through the kanuka and along the edge of a swamp we startled a pheasant and stopped for a short time, about 400 metres down the track I noticed a yearling just over 100 metres away running half way up a ridge and took a shot, I missed and it didn't stick around for seconds. We went to confirm anyway. As we checked I had a funny feeling and turned around to see a full bodied hind running below us and shot, she flipped around and stopped, coughing blood and stumbled, falling down the lip of the spur she was on. Dave and I headed down excited to see what she looked like, we found her belly up around a tree. I dragged her down to a shady spot and Dave took a picture. I then proceeded to gut her and Dave showed me how to turn her into a pack. We then headed back to Dave's ute and let her hang while we had lunch and let her hang for a while. After half an hour Keith radioed in telling us he was on the way back and wasn't far from the ute. When Keith and Logan came back they had lunch and we loaded the ute and headed back to Tauranga.







While the outcome of the 2015 HUNTS Course was much the same as in the past the input has changed quite dramatically.

Most of the applications came by way of the National Office after inquiring through their website. These were then passed on to me to make contact. Enquiries came from as far afield as Waikato, Rotorua and Whakatane.

Management of the coarse is now in the hands of a group of six – myself, Lester Polglase, Bob Tatton, Richard McEwen, Arthur Hudson and Doug Williams. Grant Hammond set up the computer pages. All communications are done by email. Works well so far.

Very few changes have been made to in the corse itself with the past program proving very successful.

Theory sessions were all at the Tauriko clubrooms while the practical side of the course was conducted at Ngamuwahine Lodge in the Kaimais, the TECT Park Rifle Range and the final one-on-one hunt was again held at Waikaremoana.

With the reduced number of participants this year we decided not to take a boat but were able to negotiate the use of a farm for 2 trainees and are working at getting others for the future.

Although several deer were seen, none were shot.

The Mountain Safety Councl as we knew it has now disbanded. Local members have now reformed under another name and have indeicated they will continue to take part in our HUNTS program. Of the 10 who did start this course ages ranged from two at 15 years, one at 17 years and the rest up to middle age.

The Paul Hooker Memorial shield for the best student went to Zak Jacobs. Well done Zak.

Ad addition to this years course was an offer from the Woodhill Fallow Mangement Committee for 2 trainees and their guides to have a hunt in their forrest Northwest of Auckland. This was in septem and a part of their "Take-A-Kid-Hunting" month. Dave Bragg and myself took the two 15 year old boys, Logan Gillard and Jon Howard, both obtaining their first deer before lunch on the Saturday.

We made it back to Tauranga that evening. Well done to both of you. Their stories and photos elsewhere.

This trip was funded by the Milli Lovell Trust left with this branch for this very purpose. Thank you so much Milli.

The thank you list for all the assistance given is huge. Without it corses like this would not happen. The Mountain Safety guys, the Army firearms crew, bow hunting and especially our club members who have given both time and product. No names, but you know who you are. Thank you all.










Hunting Safety Guidelines (Some suggestions from committee discussions)

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- 4. Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.







BOP Branch Personal Locator Beacons (PLB's) For Hire

Available to Branch members for hire. These devices can save lives by drastically reducing Search and Rescue times.

Members will need to:

- 1. Book the units in advance.
- 2. Be a current member and show their membership card when picking them up.
- 3. Fill in an Outdoors Intention Form to be held by the Branch custodian issuing the unit.
- 4. Pay a \$40 cash bond, refundable on return, in original condition and on time.
- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640). There is no cost for the renewal of the unit if it is used in an emergency but if possible we will need it returned. Any costs incurred for rescue by emergency services or false PLB activation will be the sole responsibility of the user.

CODE OF ETHICS

A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact. Aldo Leopold, The Sand County Almanac.

A member of the New Zealand Deerstalkers' Association Incorporated will be expected to;

- 1. Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same
- 2. Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws
- 4. Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity 'in situ'
- 6. Practise the Field Guidelines when out hunting
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.
