

HUNTS Course 2016

It was quite a surprise to find myself sitting in a room full of hunters at the Deerstalkers Association headquarters!! Never in my wildest dreams did I think I would ever be a hunter, armed and dangerous (to deer), planning to stalk around in the bush like a commando.... But that's what being a father brings, a life full of surprises!!

How did I come to be sitting in that room? Well, that started when we moved into a lifestyle block and the kids took to making their own bows and arrows. Despite a great deal of effort and enthusiasm, no living thing was ever in danger. This soon progressed to purchased bows and arrows, and membership at the O'Hara archery Centre outside Paengaroa. Again excitement and great endeavor didn't put anything on the table so we busted out my 30-year-old slug gun and tried really hard to put a dent in the local rabbit population. This soon progressed to a modern .22 slug gun and then a .22 rim fire rifle. By this time, I had my gun license and deer hunting was on the agenda. My son and I did a "test run" with a guide down in Whanganui and came home with a (small) freezer full of fallow meat. At this point there was no turning back and I figured it I'm jumping into this hunting thing, then I might as well be "all-in" so I registered for the HUNTS course.

Firstly, a word about the people who ran the course, Keith, Bob, Anja, Doug, Jamie, Les, Graham, Lester, Brent, John and others. This bunch of "good blokes" have many lifetimes of experience and stories between them. I doubt there is much they have not seen over the years and we're lucky that they are so willing to give up their time to share everything they know.

The course content was as varied as it was interesting. From river crossing to first aid, and photography to marksmanship the course was well thought out and contained everything a would-be hunter needs to know to get started. There was big focus on safety and after completing the course I felt confident enough to head into the bush knowing I had the right gear, and even better, I now know how to use my map and compass!

Now for some anecdotes:

I learnt that there actually is no right way to hunt..... When it came to stalking deer in the bush we were told that you had to be deadly quiet and at all costs be aware of the wind. I imagined commando crawling through the bush covered in face paint not breaking a single twig. We were also told that you might as well just walk normally and if there was one deer it would run away before you got anywhere near it, but if there were three or more they'd think you were one of them and be sitting ducks! Conflicting.... Confusing!

I learnt that Swandri's are a non-negotiable part of a hunter's wardrobe. The gear list for the weekend at Ngamuwahine was well thought out and contained everything you'd expect to see. Thermals, jersey, jacket, raincoat, hat sleeping bag and the like. It also, very specifically included a "Swandri". I couldn't figure out why you needed a Swandri when I already had a raincoat and a fleece? It's because real hunters have Swandri's of course!!

I learnt, finally, why hunters wear all that cammo gear. I asked this question multiple ways on the course. Why bother with all that camouflage gear when you're going to stick a whole bunch of blaze on top of it? I was worried that I needed to spend a ton of money on new cammo gear and wanted to make sure I really needed it. Finally, I just asked straight out, "would you come hunting with me it I wore this bright blue rain coat?" The crew looked a bit perplexed, but after some thought said "yes of course, although it might make a bit of noise". So why wear cammo gear then? Because that's what hunters do!

And finally, I learnt that if you see a deer, then shoot it. On the Waikarimoana hunt, one of the would-be hunters spotted a deer and as he frantically tried to get the attention of the instructor it ran away. When asked what he should do next time, the instructor said "shoot the bloody thing"!!

Seriously though, if you are a newbie, or experienced hunter then attending the HUNTS course is absolutely a worthwhile investment in both time and money. There isn't any other way to learn such a huge amount of valuable information in such a short time. The instructors are highly experienced and more than happy to share whatever information they have. It's also a great way to meet other likeminded people. Thanks for making this such a fantastic course.




Bricks







A smart choice

BOP Branch Personal Locator Beacons (PLB's) FOR HIRE

Available to Branch members for hire. These devices can save lives by drastically reducing Search and Rescue times.

Members will need to:


- 1. Book the units in advance.
- 2. Be a current member and show their membership card when picking them up.
- 3. Fill in an Outdoors Intention Form to be held by the Branch custodian issuing the unit.
- 4. Pay a \$40 cash bond, refundable on return, in original condition and on time.
- 5. Pay a \$10-20 donation per trip, on return, for hire of the unit.

Hire will be on a per trip basis, based on a maximum of a 21 day trip. The units will not be insured because of the cost, so any damage or loss will be payable by the user (approx. \$640). There is no cost for the renewal of the unit if it is used in an

emergency but if possible we will need it returned. Any costs incurred for rescue by emergency services or false PLB activation will be the sole responsibility of the user.

Hunting Safety Guidelines

Hunting Safety Guidelines (Some suggestions from committee discussions)

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- 4. Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.



- 2. Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws
- 4. Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity 'in situ'
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.
