

# NZDA BOP HUNTER BUDDY PROGRAM

## THIS YEAR WE LAUNCHED THE NZDA BOP HUNTER BUDDY PROGRAM.

The purpose of the Hunter Buddy Program is *To* provide an opportunity for new members and postHUNTS course graduate hunters to gain valuable experience with more seasoned hunters, in order to develop and consolidate skills and knowledge".

In addition to this, the program aims "to establish friendships and support networks for new hunters within the club to enable them to feel a sense of belonging to a hunting community of outdoor enthusiasts<sup>\*</sup>.

If you're an experienced hunter, think about how your knowledge and skills could benefit those new to the adventure of hunting. If you're a novice hunter think about what you can do to prepare yourself for your next hunting adventure and grow your capabilities.

The HUNTS course is still the best way for those new to hunting to immerse themselves in the basics of hunting and establish a solid foundation of knowledge to build on in the future.

The Hunter Buddy Program provides the opportunity for those who have completed a HUNTS course to continue being mentored by more seasoned hunters as well as the opportunity for those less experienced and new to the Branch to build on their existing knowledge, while establishing relationships with other members.

Experienced hunters volunteering to be 'buddied up' with an inexperienced hunter will be vetted by those coordinating the program to ensure inexperienced hunters are paired up with a suitably capable hunter who has the necessary experience.

Experienced hunters who participate in the program and who meet the criteria will be entered into a prize draw, with the lucky winner taking away a Stoney Creek Stalking Pullover (courtesy of Stoney Creek) and a \$200 Hamills voucher.

# MY FIRST STAG TARARUA FOREST PARK FEBRUARY 1960

ACK IN THE 1960'S, THE TRAMPING CLUBS IN THE WELLINGTON REGION WERE VERY STRONG AND ACTIVE, SO I JOINED THE WELLINGTON TRAMPING CLUB (WITH 412 MEMBERS AND ONLY THE 3RD LARGEST CLUB IN THE AREA). THE IDEA BEING THAT I COULD LEARN THE ROAD ENDS AND TRACKS SO IT WOULD SAVE ME A LOT OF TIME IN MY HUNTING, WHICH WAS MY NO. 1 CHOICE. STILL, MOST OF THE TRIPS I DID WITH THE CLUB, I CARRIED A 303 RIFLE AND GOT THE ODD DEER, AND MOST PARTY MEMBERS WERE MORE THAN HAPPY TO GET A BIT OF FRESH VENISON TO TAKE HOME.

All of the main huts, and some of the tracks were maintained by tramping clubs or NZDA, a bit like our branch looking after 3 huts in the Kaimais. Sometimes they had a combined working party and one such event took place about 3 weeks before this hunting trip.

The combined working party was to cut and mark a new track to bypass the old part of the track that went up the Upper Otaki River to the Waitewaewae hut, as the river was often in flood and therefore very dangerous. Over 60 volunteers spent the weekend working on the new track and completed the job to the hut on the sunny Sunday afternoon. A very good effort, as in those days it was a 4-5 hour trip into the Waitewaewae hut from the road end.

As I had work commitments, I was not on that working party, but I was still very keen to get in, have a look around and check the new track out. As I had been working for 2 weekends, I took some time out a couple of weeks later, and on the Tuesday left for my first 3 day solo trip.

The drive from the Hutt in my old Austin 8 was always a mission, and the old gravel road into the Forks meant that I had to pay attention. I got to the Roaring Meg stream and that was where the road stopped back then, so it was sort the gear out and get into it.

After a 20 minute walk you drop down into the main Otaki River below the Forks. If the river is down, that's where we used to cross. It didn't hold good memories for me, as this was the spot where the previous year 5 of us tried to cross when the river was in full flood.

We were washed off our feet and down the river into a nightmare of muddy water, logs and moving boulders. We lost a lot of gear and a bit of skin, but got out of it with our lives, so that was the important part, for sure. We had been swept down the river a fair way, and it was only the fact that we had managed to stay linked together that saved us.

I remember that we got washed into a big eddy on one of the bends and that is how we got out of the torrent. We had all swallowed a lot of water, so we just lay on the bank and spewed out the excess.

Since that day I have hunted and tramped in remote country for just over 60 years, so it was a good lesson for me. *"If in doubt, wait it out,"* as it is often surprising just how quickly some rivers can go down.

Well, back to my hunting trip. After crossing the main Otaki River, the track sidles up the Waitatapia stream, over the headwaters, then follows a few ridges before dropping down into the Waitewaewae hut, situated on the Upper Otaki River.

Back then the trip would take about 4-5 hours, so my

plan was to hunt my way in, getting to the hut just before dark. The day was fine, so I stopped a few times for a look around and about 3pm I reached the new sidle track.

What a good job they had made of it, very well marked (painted tin lids) and going through some very nice country: so I slowed down into hunting mode. The new track followed a leading ridge, then dropped into a nice bush saddle to then sidle down towards the main river. I had just started hunting on the sidle when some movement caught my eye. I froze, stayed very still and slowly the best stag that I had ever seen worked his way towards me.

What to do, as you can't take the pack off. So I waited for him to start nibbling away at some vegetation. I loaded the rifle (.303 with open sights) and took a shot from about 50 metres.

The stag leaped forward, took about 5 paces, then dropped to the ground. I was not taking any chances, so I reloaded and made my way over to the beast, a heavy 9 pointer. *"THE STAG* LEAPED FORWARD. TOOK ABOUT 5 PACES. THEN DROPPED TO THE GROUND. I WAS NOT **TAKING ANY** CHANCES, SO I **RELOADED AND** MADE MY WAY **OVER TO THE BEAST. A HEAVY 9 POINTER. WHAT** A SIGHT. WHAT A FEELING AND SUCH A RUSH OF EMOTIONS. AS I STOOD THERE AND SOAKED IT ALL UP, I KNEW THAT I WAS TOTALLY HOOKED **ON HUNTING.**"

What a sight, what a feeling and such a rush of emotions. As I stood there and soaked it all up, I knew that I was totally hooked on hunting.

With only about 2 hours of daylight left, I was not sure how long it would take to get to the hut, so I decided to hang the meat and head and to pick them up on the way out. I only took the back steaks with me. I got to the hut just on dark, still very high on adrenaline, so I set about cooking some of the venison for tea.

It was tough as can be, but still the best meat that I had ever tasted. In those days, most of the main huts had 2 large platforms for sleeping on. They were cold and hard, but dry.

Rats were always a problem, so the trick was to leave some meat and bread out on the lower platform and you slept on the top platform, with a bit of peace.

The next day dawned fine, but if I had known what the day would bring, I would have stayed in bed. I decided to collect the meat and antlers and head back out to the road-end.

I got away early, found the meat and head, stowed it all into my pack and started the long trip out with what was a big load. I took my time and had lots of rests.

After 3 hours I was about 2/3 of the way out when disaster struck. Just as I dropped into the head of the Waitatapia stream I slipped on a steep bit of track, with my knee hitting a rock on the way down. With that load on, it was some impact.

Within minutes the knee and upper leg started to swell out to a huge size, and the leg just locked up completely. I still remember there was a lot of pain.

WHAT TO DO: the chances of meeting anyone midweek in there were close to zero, so it was up to me to get out. I dumped all the meat, just keeping the rest of the back-steaks.

I hid the head up a tree and dumped some gear, just keeping my sleeping bag and basics in case I did not get out. The trip to the car took me 5-1/2 hours, as the leg was locked up tight as a drum, so I basically dragged it along, using the rifle as a crutch.

I didn't stop at all, as I knew that if I stopped and cooled down, that would be it. I arrived at the car, wet through after crossing the river. In too much pain to try and change, I drove straight to the Hutt hospital, and what a mission that was with one leg that wouldn't bend, a dodgy clutch and not very good brakes.

That road trip took me 1-1/2 hours and I was totally spent when I turned the key off, so I sat and waited in the carpark until someone came past.

I yelled out or help and they got a wheelchair, got me inside, washed and changed into a dry gown, and into bed where I was to stay for 4 days as the leg had been bleeding internally. I watched them suck 2 large syringes of blood and muck out of my leg, and when the pressure went down, what a relief.

Once the leg mended, I was right into hunting and tramping again. I figured that if I set my mind to it, I could do most things, as it often comes down to the mental side of it.

Since this solo trip I have been on a lot more over the years, the longest being into the Upper Pike River in South Westland.

That trip was for 26 days, and I may write about it sometime.

# NZDA BOP CLUB CHILLER

#### CHILLER USE RULES

- Chiller use is a privilege that may be removed if access is abused or rules not adhered to.
- Clean up after yourself, every time you access the chiller.
- Use a fish bin or other suitable container to catch dripping blood etc. and remove from site when you take your meat away.
- No skinning or butchering on the NZDA premises. The chiller is for hanging only, no processing of any sort is allowed.
- All waste must be removed from the premises when you take your meat away, including any part of an animal, blood, and all wastewater.
- All animals/meat must be tagged with a label denoting the date hung, name and contact number of the person who hung it in the chiller. Any meat without a label will be considered a donation to the club.
- The maximum time for hanging any meat or animal is 10 days.
- Do not hang any foul meat or contaminated carcasses.
- Take care not to contaminate anyone else's meat with hair, blood, dirt etc.

It is preferable to hang all carcasses with the skin on and to hang any partially processed meat in a breathable bag or muslin cloth. Hanging carcasses and meat should not touch the chiller walls or they may (partially) freeze.

Respect the facility and other members meat.

## **RANGE STANDING ORDERS REMINDER: "THE RANGE RULES"**

Range ticket holders CANNOT allow other non-range ticket holders or non-members to shoot at our range. The name, date and time start time of shooters shall be recorded each time they use the range. Range flags and warning signs are to be enabled at the following locations prior to firing:

- The Range status sign's 'Caution Range in Use' warning shall be displayed when the range is open for use.
- The red firing line flag shall be hoisted when the range is open for use.
- The firing line flag must be lowered, and the range status sign closed when the range is closed.

An empty chamber indicator (ECI) MUST be inserted in the chamber at all times except when the Range Officer allows the shooter onto the firing point and gives permission to remove the ECI.







# **CODE OF ETHICS**

"A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact."

Aldo Leopold, The Sand County Almanac

A MEMBER OF THE NEW ZEALAND DEERSTALKERS' ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED WILL BE EXPECTED TO:

- Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same.
- Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him.
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws.
- Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors.
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity *'in situ*'.
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting.
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.



## HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

# Some suggestions from committee discussions.

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- 4. Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.
