### **PRESIDENTS REPORT:** SEPTEMBER 2022

HI EVERYONE, IT'S THAT TIME OF THE YEAR WHEN WE'RE ALL DEEP IN THE GRIND AND REUBEN HAS ASKED ME TO TAKE SOME WEIGHT OFF HIS SHOULDERS AND WRITE UP A VP REPORT IN HIS PLACE.

It may not look like it, but the last couple of months have been an extremely busy period behind the scenes. It was dominated by the Annual Conference held over the weekend of 29<sup>th</sup> - 30<sup>th</sup> July. For those of you who are unfamiliar with the way the NZDA works, there are 49 branches like ours, and every year they gather for a Conference.

The Conference is hosted by a different branch each year, and the proceedings are run by the National Board. A huge range of topics are covered, and some highlights from this year included address from the Conservation Minister Poto William, Nicole McKee from the Act Party, and Ben Reddiex from DOC.

Throughout Conference I was blown away by the general positivity and strength that we have as an organization. No longer are we a bunch of angry old men squabbling over 1080, rather, we are a united group that's actively engaging with the right people and government departments to get meaningful results.

An example of this is that we recently received a grant of \$700,000 from the Jobs

for Nature grant which goes towards our Hunts Course... how amazing is that!

Many of you may not know that the NZDA employs a CEO. Gwyn Thurlow, to manage the day-to-day and provide a professional front. I understand his appointment was contentious at the time, however the results speak for themselves, with membership increasing by over 4000 people since his appointment.

I was blown away to learn that he's now invited to DOC meetings and enjoys a direct line to the Conservation Minister as well as many other politicians. As Gwyn explained, it's better to have a seat at the table than to be feeding off the scraps.

On the celebration side of things, congratulations to our newsletter editor, Nik Maxwell, who helped our club win the Rotorua Branch Trophy for best Newsletter. Also to Sarah Cotching who won the Philip Holden Trophy for best hunting story, as well as taking out 3rd place open section Tahr. Finally to local legend, Keith Theobald who was awarded for Long Service.

On the business side of things, the National AGM is also conducted as part of the Conference. I was lucky to be elected as one of two North Island Representatives to the

## WINTER IN THE KAIMANAWAS

E WERE ALL VERY EXCITED AND RUBY WAS HIGH ON ANTICIPATION AS WE SET OFF FOR CHARLES' PLACE EARLY ON THURSDAY MORNING. THIS TRIP WAS SUPPOSED TO HAVE GONE AHEAD 12 MONTHS EARLIER BUT, NO THANKS TO OUR GLORIOUS LEADER, NZ HAD GONE INTO LOCK DOWN THE DAY BEFORE WE WERE SUPPOSED TO FLY IN 2021. RUBY HAD BEEN PROMISED THE OPPORTUNITY IN 2020 SO THE 2-YEAR WAIT HAD BEEN GRUELING. FINALLY, WE WERE GOING.

The lads had been doing this trip annually since Lewis' 30<sup>th</sup> birthday trip in 2018 and this would be our fourth one in five years. The plan was always to get somewhere remote with a warm hut in the middle of winter and try to bag as many animals as possible



while having a good time with the lads. Previous trips had resulted in about twenty deer all up, so we had big expectations for big hills, big carries, big yarns and a big haul.

Unfortunately, there was a last-minute cancellation

by a longtime friend from my Air Force days who had just become a victim of the sniffly nose house arrest. He was gutted, having also missed the trip in 2020 due to being locked in Auckland, again no thanks to our glorious leader.

Three years in a row ruined by tyrants. There was certainly plenty of resentment festering among the lads. All loaded up and off to Taupo to meet the others for a quick coffee before arriving at the hangar.

For six of the group, it would be their first helicopter flight, the two men, two kids and two dogs were buzzing as we weighed our gear and got sorted into three loads. 10 blokes, 3 kids and 3 dogs was quite the hunting party and between us we had all the gear you could hope for.

By 11 am we were lacing our boots at the hut and grabbing our rifles to head out for an afternoon hunt. The ice on everything and the snow falling on our arrival had us thinking about firewood for the



evening as there was none at the hut, not an ideal start but not much could dampen our spirits.

Off we set to have our first look around and try to bag some camp meat. Heading up high and getting in position on a slip for a good glass we managed to spot a few animals about 700 metres up a valley. We worked our way down using scrub for cover and headed across the valley floor until we were under 300 metres from our quarry.

A shot was fired on change of light and we set off for a search amongst the long grass and shrubs in the dark. It didn't take too long for Bess to find the young staq. We were all pleased,

including the dogs, but the kids were really stoked with such a good start to the trip. Everyone got involved in the field dressing before we set off for a 3km hike back to the hut.

As the days went by it was apparent that the deer weren't out and about in the numbers seen during



previous trips, but this didn't stop some from eating lead for breakfast and dinner. There was plenty of miles walked and climbed, enough meat to fill a freezer and tired but happy hunters snoring every night.

Ruby and I spent the late afternoons sitting in the scrub with Bess snuggled up at our feet while we glassed the hills looking for white bums amongst the bushes.

Unfortunately, we weren't finding any animals and on the second to last morning Ruby was itching to get a shot away after glassing on sunrise for a couple of hours. The only thing moving about other than her, Bess and I was a gaggle of geese by the river. She drilled one and I got my boots wet retrieving it. We breasted the goose and headed back to the hut for warmth by the fire, some lunch, and dry boots.

That afternoon there was plenty of boning out being done to the frosty deer hanging on the porch and we enjoyed finishing off the treats that we'd brought in.

The plan was for a last-ditch effort at the end of the day before sinking a few tins and having a sleep in.

The next morning was a bustle of butchering, packing

and cleaning before our lift arrived dead on time. Back at the hanger we were relieved to be heading home after a tough but rewarding few days.

The pilot told us the temperature had been down below -11 degrees Celsius which made us smile, we had been very cold but didn't realise the temperature had been quite that low.

All in all, another great trip with the lads and great to share the experience with Ruby. Plenty of hard yards, sharing laughs, and good food are what it's all about.

We're all looking forward to next year and crossing our fingers there won't be any tyrannical interference to our plans.


### $6^{TH}$ SEP ~ NZDA BAY OF PLENTY

### THIS YEAR WE LAUNCHED THE NZDA BOP HUNTER BUDDY PROGRAM.

The purpose of the Hunter Buddy Program is *To* provide an opportunity for new members and postHUNTS course graduate hunters to gain valuable experience with more seasoned hunters, in order to develop and consolidate skills and knowledge".

In addition to this, the program aims "to establish friendships and support networks for new hunters within the club to enable them to feel a sense of belonging to a hunting community of outdoor enthusiasts<sup>\*</sup>.

If you're an experienced hunter, think about how your knowledge and skills could benefit those new to the adventure of hunting. If you're a novice hunter think about what you can do to prepare yourself for your next hunting adventure and grow your capabilities.

The HUNTS course is still the best way for those new to hunting to immerse themselves in the basics of hunting and establish a solid foundation of knowledge to build on in the future.

The Hunter Buddy Program provides the opportunity for those who have completed a HUNTS course to continue being mentored by more seasoned hunters as well as the opportunity for those less experienced and new to the Branch to build on their existing knowledge, while establishing relationships with other members.

Experienced hunters volunteering to be 'buddied up' with an inexperienced hunter will be vetted by those coordinating the program to ensure inexperienced hunters are paired up with a suitably capable hunter who has the necessary experience.

Experienced hunters who participate in the program and who meet the criteria will be entered into a prize draw, with the lucky winner taking away a Stoney Creek Stalking Pullover (courtesy of Stoney Creek) and a \$200 Hamills voucher.

Initially we are bringing all National Range Officers (NRO's) up to speed on the updated RSO's then ALL range ticket holders will need to attend a refresher course.

If you are an NRO and have not yet attended an NRO Refresher Course the last scheduled course is Wednesday 14 September, 7.00pm at the club rooms. If you can not make this MUST email range@deerstalkers.bop.org.nz and let us know so that alternative arrangements can be made for you.

If you are a Range Ticket holder you will shortly receive an email outlining various Range Ticket Holder Refresher Courses that will be offered. Attendance at 1 of these courses is compulsory and your range tag will be deactivated if you do not attend. Initially the coursers will be held on a week night at our Tauriko club rooms however other dates and venues (most likely the range amenity building) will be offered.

### NZDA BOP CLUB CHILLER

#### CHILLER USE RULES

- Chiller use is a privilege that may be removed if access is abused or rules not adhered to.
- Clean up after yourself, every time you access the chiller.
- Use a fish bin or other suitable container to catch dripping blood etc. and remove from site when you take your meat away.
- No skinning or butchering on the NZDA premises. The chiller is for hanging only, no processing of any sort is allowed.
- All waste must be removed from the premises when you take your meat away, including any part of an animal, blood, and all wastewater.
- All animals/meat must be tagged with a label denoting the date hung, name and contact number of the person who hung it in the chiller. Any meat without a label will be considered a donation to the club.
- The maximum time for hanging any meat or animal is 10 days.
- Do not hang any foul meat or contaminated carcasses.
- Take care not to contaminate anyone else's meat with hair, blood, dirt etc.

It is preferable to hang all carcasses with the skin on and to hang any partially processed meat in a breathable bag or muslin cloth. Hanging carcasses and meat should not touch the chiller walls or they may (partially) freeze.

Respect the facility and other members meat.

### **RANGE STANDING ORDERS REMINDER: "THE RANGE RULES"**

Range ticket holders CANNOT allow other non-range ticket holders or non-members to shoot at our range. The name, date and time start time of shooters shall be recorded each time they use the range. Range flags and warning signs are to be enabled at the following locations prior to firing:

- The Range status sign's "Caution Range in Use" warning shall be displayed when the range is open for use.
- The red firing line flag shall be hoisted when the range is open for use.
- The firing line flag must be lowered, and the range status sign closed when the range is closed.

An empty chamber indicator (ECI) MUST be inserted in the chamber at all times except when the Range Officer allows the shooter onto the firing point and gives permission to remove the ECI.







### **CODE OF ETHICS**

"A peculiar virtue in wildlife ethics is that the hunter ordinarily has no gallery to applaud or disapprove of his conduct. Whatever his act they are dictated by his own conscience, rather than by a mob of onlookers. It is difficult to exaggerate the importance of this fact."

Aldo Leopold, The Sand County Almanac

A MEMBER OF THE NEW ZEALAND DEERSTALKERS' ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED WILL BE EXPECTED TO:

- Approach recreational hunting from the highest possible level of ethics, having due regard to the welfare of the animals hunted, and prevention of cruelty to the same.
- Not hunt or carry a firearm on property without the proper approval of the owner, occupier of controlling authority and shall strictly observe any conditions imposed upon him.
- 3. Be a responsible firearms owner and abide by current Firearms Laws.
- Avoid unnecessary or deliberate damage to the environment, respect property, and other users of the outdoors.
- 5. Advocate sensible conservation practices at all times and promote New Zealand's biodiversity *'in situ*'.
- 6. Practice the Field Guidelines when out hunting.
- 7. Be exemplary members of NZDA by promoting and abiding by its Rules, Field Guidelines and this Code of Ethics.



### HUNTING SAFETY GUIDELINES

## Some suggestions from committee discussions.

- 1. It is recommended that hunters wear Hi-Viz clothing at all times while in the hunting block.
- 2. Alcohol may only be consumed after the days hunting is completed.
- 3. Illicit drugs will not be tolerated.
- 4. Only load your weapon when ready to shoot at your quarry.
- 5. Identify your target beyond any doubt.
- 6. Check the firing zone for people, non-target stock, buildings etc.
- 7. Never fire above the skyline.
- 8. Unload your weapon with the barrel pointing away from any potential hazards.
- 9. Never skylark with weapons.

Formed in 1937, the New Zealand Deerstalkers' Association is New Zealand's recognised National body representing and speaking for hunters generally. The fundamental aim of the association is to ensure that the organisation and management of recreational hunting in New Zealand is carried out by hunters.
