PRESIDENTS REPORT: MAY 2023

THE HUNTING SEASON HAS PEAKED ALREADY FOR MANY OF US, FOR THOSE CHASING MORE EXOTIC SPECIES THERE'S STILL MORE AHEAD. NOW'S THE TIME TO START THINKING ABOUT THE COMING RUSA AND SAMBAR RUT OR MAKE LAST MINUTE TAHR RUT PLANS.

If you plan your hunting calendar well, there aren't many months in the year where it's not an opportune time for hunting one species or another. Do your research and ask a friend, there's always another great opportunity just waiting for you to book some hunting time in your calendar.

June 23rd is fast approaching, if you don't know what that means then maybe you've been living under a rock. Firearms registration has nearly arrived, and you need to give some thought to your personal situation and what approach you will be taking.

Many firearm owners are aiming to delay the need to register their firearms in hope that the government and legislation will change before the deadline for registration arrives in 5 years. Do some research, talk to other firearm owners, and make sure you understand the implications of the legislation and regulations.

There are certain events, such as buying ammo, that will trigger a 14-day countdown for you to register all your firearms as well as provide further information to police. If

you are concerned about registering your firearms due to the security of data held by police, or any other reason, then it could be wise to prepare to stop purchasing firearms and ammunition from the 24th of June.

There are some trigger events that you may get cornered by, such as moving house or your firearms licence expiring which limits your options. But if your firearms licence doesn't expire for 5 years or more and you don't move house in that time either, then you have the option to buy all your firearms and ammunition now and prolong registration in the hope you can avoid it altogether with a change in government either this year or in 2026.

At our May Club Night we have Gwyn Thurlow speaking. Gwyn is the NZDA CEO and General Council, based in the National Office in Wellington (just across from the new police firearms authority). This is a rare opportunity where our branch has secured Gwyn for one night only.

We've split the cost of travel with National to get Gwyn here because we believe he will be able to share a lot of the good things NZDA does for us as hunters and the benefits of being a member of the NZDA National organisation. Come and support your branch and bring your mates who


MEASURING NIGHT | TUESDAY 23RD MAY | DOORS OPEN FROM 7PM

BECOME A HUNTS INSTRUCTOR

Our HUNTS Instructors train and guide new hunters as they start their journey of learning to hunt. This is an opportunity to support the future of hunting in NZ through sharing your knowledge, skills and experience with aspiring hunters. To start the journey of becoming a HUNTS Instructor contact the committee to express your interest, they will need to support your application to the NZDA National Office to become a

Once you've gained Provisional Instructor status, and have started assisting with instructing on the course, you will undergo several assessments by a Nationally Qualified HUNTS Assessor.

When the assessor is satisfied with your level of competency as a HUNTS Instructor you will receive certification from the National Office granting you status as a Warranted HUNTS Instructor. To find out more about becoming a HUNTS Instructor, contact the committee by email at:

HUNTS COURSE GUIDES

Every year the HUNTS Course concludes with a guided one on one hunt, where each student is paired up with an experienced hunter for a guided hunt on publicly accessible land. The HUNTS Instructors rely on strong support from the members to have enough volunteer quides to pair with all the students.

If you enjoy sharing your knowledge, would like to help guide a novice hunter, and would like to be considered for the privilege of a catered weekend away hunting with the course students, then contact the HUNTS Instructors when the next course is advertised.

HUNTER BUDDY PROGRAM

We need experienced hunters to help mentor novice hunters. For details, see the section of this newsletter on the Hunter Buddy Program.

BECOME A RANGE OFFICER

Our Range Officers (NROs) are NZDA Nationally Qualified Range Officers. We require Range Officers to support our club range shooting activities and Range Open Days (public days).

To become a NRO you must pass the required theory and practical assessments. You will also require the support of the Branch Committee, usually granted on endorsement by the Range Manager. BECOME A RANGE ASSISTANT

If being a Range Officer isn't your thing, but you would still like to help with range events and Range Open Days, we need members to assist with the administration side of running range activities.

Duties could include administering the registration process for open days and other events, assisting with the administration of match scoring for scored shooting events, helping with setup and pack up before and after a range event, and helping with the kitchen and BBQ if required.

ANTLER, HORN & TUSK COMPETITION HELPERS

We need to establish an AHT Sub-Committee to plan and prepare for our Annual Antler, Horn & Tusk and Photographic Competitions.

This sub-committee is ideally suited to those who are qualified Douglas Score Measurers, those aspiring to become qualified or those with a strong interest in wildlife photography.

BECOME A DOUGLAS SCORE MEASURER

The AHT Competition requires Qualified Douglas Score Measurers to measuring all the heads and jaws that are entered in our annual competition. Normally this is all done on Measuring Night which is usually the third or fourth Tuesday in May.

BILLBOARD HELPERS

The three billboards at the front of our clubrooms provide our club with a good source of income in addition to member subscriptions. This relatively passive income supports as much as one third of our operating expenses, helping to provide facilities for our members while keeping subscriptions low.

From time to time these Billboards require changing, often in a short time window, usually around the end/start of the month. It only takes two blokes 30 minutes to change a billboard skin over so it's not a big time commitment.

WORKING BEES

It is commonly said amongst our members and volunteers in other clubs, "it's always the same old people" that put their hands up to help. Be one of those people, put your hand up to help.

When there's a working bee, turn up and give some of your precious time away. Remember, everyone has the same amount of time in a day (24 hours). Others regularly give a portion of their precious time to support the organisations that you benefit from, give some of your own time back and contribute to the collective good of your club and community. THINK SAFETY / PRACTICE SAFETY / HUNT SAFELY

BACKGROUND

The Bay of Plenty Branch (BoP) of the New Zealand Deerstalkers Association (NZDA) conduct a Hunter National Training Scheme (HUNTS) course each year that usually runs from July to September. Please click here to view the full course information. The NZDA HUNTS programme is administered by the NZDA through its National office in Wellington.

It is designed to ensure that students receive a good background to most facets of the recreational sport of hunting in New Zealand. This ensures the continued safe practices encouraged by the NZDA, with respect to safe firearms handling, conservation and bush craft.

CURRICULUM

The course is intense and concentrates on the main topics associated with the recreational hunter under field conditions within New Zealand. The curriculum includes:

ETHICS AND ECOLOGY:

Students will learn about NZDA hunting ethics to enable them to promote the sport within New Zealand as well as a presentation by qualified instructors on Ecology and the Flora and Fauna of New Zealand.

FIREARMS LAW AND SAFETY, MARKSMANSHIP:

A firearms licence is NOT required to attend this course. Students will lean firearm safety and be shown the types of firearm used for hunting New Zealand game species.

They will learn how to correctly apply the principles of marksmanship, the care and cleaning of the firearm as well as use of the firearm under range and field conditions

OUTDOOR FIRST AID:

Students will learn under qualified instructors, how to identify & treat the signs and symptoms of hypothermia as well as burns, fractures, cuts, building stretchers out of what's available in the bush and many other aspects of Outdoor First Aid.

THE DOUGLAS SCORING SYSTEM:

Students will be shown how to measure their trophies correctly under the Douglas Scoring System adopted by NZDA. All game species of New Zealand will be included.

BUSH CRAFT:

Students will learn under practical conditions the many aspects of bush craft taught by instructors with many years of practical experience.

PLANNING:

Students will be taught how to plan a hunting trip and what equipment may be needed.

NAVIGATION:

Students will be taught how to navigate using a map and compass.

RIVER CROSSING:

Students will be taught safe and responsible river crossing procedures.

HUNTING TECHNIQUES:

Students will be taught how to hunt safely and effectively and learn techniques from instructors who have made this their chosen sport for many years.

The course consists of several evening sessions at the branch clubrooms, a range day, practical weekend and culminates in a weekend hunt paired up one on one with an experienced hunter.

ELIGIBILITY

The course is open to all over the age of 16 years old. Younger teenagers may be considered if their parents are also attending the course - please enquire via email.

The course is restricted to 15 participants. The first 15 paid up will have priority.

EQUIPMENT:

A training manual is supplied to each participant as part of the course.

You will need to bring a pen and paper (and enthusiasm).

Basic equipment will be required for the practical and hunting weekend trips. A list of

essential equipment will be provided prior to these events to ensure students obtain the right type of equipment and come suitably prepared.

FEES

The 2023 course fees have been set at: \$450

This covers the cost of materials, resources, accommodation and food during the course. NZDA Bay of Plenty Branch is a registered charity and does not aim to profit from the HUNTS course. The course is offered as a public service for the benefit of aspiring hunters.

For insurance purposes, course participants must be financial members of NZDA. (Associate membership is inadequate as it doesn't include insurance benefits.)

We will waive the \$50 joining fee if you are attending the HUNTS course.

Please select "I want to enroll in a HUNTS course" as the reason for joining and the invoice will be amended accordingly.

QUALIFICATION

At the successful completion of the course, students will be presented with a certificate endorsing their achievement.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Subject matter to be relevant to hunting, hunting country and/or associated activities of NZDA members and have been taken from land within New Zealand and, in respect to SECTION A only, not taken from any form of conveyance.

- In SECTIONS A, B1, B2, B3, subject matter to be in its wild outdoor state and not in any form of captivity. Photographs of wounded or dead animals, birds, insects, reptiles or amphibians will be disqualified.
- In SECTION C, the subject matter is to be scenic and relative to hunting country, any human activity should be of minor importance.
- In SECTION D, the subject matter is to be of any NZ floral (tree, plant, vegetation, bush etc) subject in its natural environment.
- In SECTION E, the main component of the subject matter is to be human

activity, ie camp scenes, hunting or NZDA associated activities. Human interaction must be the main feature of the photograph and should tell or indicate a story.

- 5. SECTION F: Best print of all sections.
- 6. SECTION G: Thames Valley Deerstalkers' Association Junior Photography Trophy All junior photographs entered into any existing NZDA photography category are eligible for inclusion in this section of the competition. The judges/organisers have the right to place any junior photographic entry into the competition even if they have not specifically requested to enter this competition so long as their validity as a junior is confirmed.

The facilities on offer at our 300m TECT Park Range are fantastic and are a great asset to our club and region but it does cost a lot to have these facilities available and range fees need to cover the costs or the range is not financially viable.

RANGE MAINTENANCE

Thanks to our members that attend our working bees at the range - as they say, few hands make light work so it would be good to see some new faces assisting at working bees.

We have a core group of members putting in most of the hours but we know there are many more active and regular range shooters out there that should be helping.

We are currently working on extending the 100m, 200m and 300m target lines so that each firing position (1 to 15) will shoot more directly straight down the range as opposed to the slight angle that is currently needed.

This will require an extension and rebuild to the target lines. Initial earth works have been completed and the final tidy up of dirt will be completed in February.

We are now on the look out for someone to take on the project to build the backstop and target extension. We need someone who can lead this project, organise materials and equipment and make it happen.

NZDA BOP CLUB CHILLER

CHILLER USE RULES

- Chiller use is a privilege that may be removed if access is abused or rules not adhered to.
- Clean up after yourself, every time you access the chiller.
- Use a fish bin or other suitable container to catch dripping blood etc. and remove from site when you take your meat away.
- No skinning or butchering on the NZDA premises. The chiller is for hanging only, no processing of any sort is allowed.
- All waste must be removed from the premises when you take your meat away, including any part of an animal, blood, and all wastewater.
- All animals/meat must be tagged with a label denoting the date hung, name and contact number of the person who hung it in the chiller. Any meat without a label will be considered a donation to the club.
- The maximum time for hanging any meat or animal is 10 days.
- Do not hang any foul meat or contaminated carcasses.
- Take care not to contaminate anyone else's meat with hair, blood, dirt etc.

It is preferable to hang all carcasses with the skin on and to hang any partially processed meat in a breathable bag or muslin cloth. Hanging carcasses and meat should not touch the chiller walls or they may (partially) freeze.

Respect the facility and other members meat.

RANGE STANDING ORDERS REMINDER: "THE RANGE RULES"

Range ticket holders CANNOT allow other non-range ticket holders or non-members to shoot at our range. The name, date and time start time of shooters shall be recorded each time they use the range. Range flags and warning signs are to be enabled at the following locations prior to firing:

- The Range status sign's "Caution Range in Use" warning shall be displayed when the range is open for use.
- The red firing line flag shall be hoisted when the range is open for use.
- The firing line flag must be lowered, and the range status sign closed when the range is closed.

An empty chamber indicator (ECI) MUST be inserted in the chamber at all times except when the Range Officer allows the shooter onto the firing point and gives permission to remove the ECI.




